Though I don't belong to the National Black Caucus, I'm posting this statement, issued a few days ago by that caucus, because it has important comments on a current crisis situation in the GPUS. I appreciate the statement's encouragement of us to go forward.

Concerning the Georgia Green Party and the Transgender specific related issues.

The National Black Caucus of the Green Party of the United states (NBC-GP) considers its role and relationships with other marginalized people and our allies to be a cornerstone in our work. We value discourse and reflective inquiry to resolve conflicts and the many pressing issues in out society today. As such we do not, yet, support expulsion of any affiliated state or caucus, on the issues of languaging around Women's rights, Children's rights, and Transperson's rights. We are stating without reservation all of these are human rights and need to be take seriously. To this end we are aware that there are issues on many sides of these issues that need to have serious consideration. We are talking about real people with real issues and their concerns cannot be taken lightly.

In times like these we need to be the Party that leads. We cannot dig into silos and demand that others meet us where we are; but we need to be willing to meet each other in a space where honesty and integrity can be found. Where we recognize that we may not always get it right, we may not always use the right phrase, or the terminology but what we will always get right is the intention to live in harmony and promote the best possible change to advance progressive causes and human rights.



After the passing of the great Bruce Dixon it appears that Hugh Esco decided to make two very divisive issues (trans rights and sex worker rights) as his main issues to campaign on. He was only able to assemble around 9 people to vote on this. Giving the nature of party registration and ballot access in Georgia its hard to even know what party these people were registered as. What is extremely hurtful about this is that Hugh was a friend of mine and I was one of his strongest allies in the party. People who he thinks are his allies are not - they are simply reactionaries who share the same backwards views on a few issues. However this was before I found out about his terrible politics on trans rights.

Giving Hugh all this attention is what he wants. He wants to show that he is persecuted for his moralistic crusade. This makes him feel as though he is on the cutting edge. When confronted Hugh retreats to the more gray area questions about biology and sex. This is manipulation, not unlike the way pro-lifers retreat into discussions about when life begins to pull at people's heartstrings and muddy the waters away from the realities of our society and a true analysis of POWER and patriarchy. This way he can play victim as if he is being attacked by the "trans agenda" or whatever. On this topic he sounds no different than a neocon. This is pure manipulation. We do not have to all have to agree on the exact same sociological or medical definition of sex vs gender in order to unconditionally support trans rights. The fact is that Hugh and a handful of people claiming to represent the greater interests of the GAGP voted to endorse a document contains even more vile language than NC onerous HB2. This document not only erases the existence of Female-to-male or non binary trans persons because they do not fit into their victimization agenda of trans rights somehow eroding feminism but the document also makes trans people sound like predators.

This is EXACTLY the kind of language that tens of thousands of North Carolinians took to streets and occupied schools to defeat in HB2. Hugh and his friends are using the GAGP name to promote his anti-trans agenda in a time when we need to be uniting. He has brought great harm upon the image of our party and his views are strongly denounced by the vast majority of youth of all backgrounds, ethnicity, and even major religions.

I don't support expulsion at this time. I think a far better solution is to implore those who are interested in the Green Party and who live in GA and who deplore this move by the GAGP to meet, to organize and to overturn it. If we can't organize well enough to get 20 people in a room then we have much bigger problems than the GAGP resolution.

If trans rights can co-exist with the rights of women and children, why is the Lavender Caucus so excised?






